December 2018

Bath by train. Group booking for rail fare is £14. Morning coffee at The Pump Rooms. Many places to visit including the Bath Christmas Market. Lunch venue is Hall & Woodhouse.

2019

10th January

The January BPT will be to Pontypool Museum (£3 entry), on the 10th of January. We leave Cardiff around 9:45 and arrive at the museum at 11:00. We take tea or coffee in their rather quaint tea room serving delicious home made cakes.

The permanent collection reveals the rich and unique history of the Borough from Llantarnam in the south to Blaenavon in the north. It features prehistoric objects and medieval treasure troves, to industrial revolution items and cultural artefacts as well as fine and decorative art including the famous Pontypool & Usk Japanware. This collection tells the story of how events have helped to shape the valley, the landscape and its people. Inside the museum the Oriel Barker Art Gallery hosts both local artists and eighteenth century paintings by Thomas and Benjamin Barker and other artworks held by Torfaen Museum Trust.

We take lunch at the Greenhouse Inn in Llantarnam after paying a quick visit to St Michaels churchyard to find the grave of soldier John Fielding whose actions at Rorke's Drift earned him a V.C. Look out for information about John Fielding at the museum.

We return to Cardiff about 4:30/5:00pm

7th February

The BPT visits the National Assembly Senedd and Pierhead buildings. We make our own way to the Bay and meet at the Senedd for coffee. This is followed by a guided tour of the Senedd which is the main public building of the National Assembly, the main centre for democracy and devolution in Wales. It houses the National Assembly for Wales' Siambr (debating chamber) and Committee Rooms. It is one of the most environmentally friendly parliament buildings in the world, where visitors can gain an insight into the workings of the Assembly.

Afterwards we walk across to the monumental Pierhead Building which houses a tribute to the history of Wales. A collection of artefacts showcase milestones in Welsh history from 950 to 1997. An Oral Histories room offers fascinating audio accounts of life in Cardiff Bay, told by a variety of contributors, from old Pierhead employees to senior statesmen. The Pierhead Suite gives us a window onto the past through a digital display that pays tribute to Welsh heroes who have made significant contributions to Welsh life and identity. Depending on the use of the building on the day, it may be possible to have

either an introductory talk or a guided tour.

Lunch will be taken at Signor Valentino a very short walk from the Pierhead building.

7th March

We travel to the famous Penderyn Distillery, in the foothills of the Brecon Beacons National Park, which produces one of the world's finest single malt whiskeys. Very limited numbers for this trip! More details to follow.

11th April

We visit the old town of Chepstow complete with its Norman castle which started construction in 1067. We have free entry to the castle which is one of the finest in Wales. We also visit Chepstow museum which is opposite the castle, here, entry is also free.

The museum's exhibits reflect the development of Chepstow, once an important port and bustling market town. The displays show the growth and decline of the port with its valuable wine and timber trades. Shipbuilding and salmon fishing and many other aspects of working life in Chepstow with settings which recapture the essence of original scenes. Pleasures and pastimes are recalled in original photographs, programmes and posters. Whilst at the museum please look out for something that may link my family to the area.

16th May

Margam Park will be our trip for May. In its grounds is the 19th Century Margam Castle, This Tudor Gothic Mansion was designed by the architect Thomas Hopper for Christopher Rice Mansel Talbot, and built between 1830 – 40. A fire in 1977 gutted the interior but the Great Hallway is on display to the public. Of course its 17th Century Orangery can be viewed as well as monastic ruins set within the Park. You will have time to wander some of the extensive grounds and perhaps even a trip on the miniature 24" railway (£1 concessionary fare). Look out for the fairy tail village (for children aged 6 to 10, but hey!!), it will bring a smile to your face!

Lunch Ye Olde Wine house or Braseria (sic) El Prado, near Bridgend.

13th June

One of the most exciting heritage projects in South Wales, Cosmeston Medieval Village lets you step back in time to see, touch, and even smell how life was in 14th century Wales.

We meet the villagers, all dressed in period costume, and experience how they lived. Our guided tour costs £3.50 (concession).

Coffee at the cafe in the park and lunch afterwards at the The Mint and Mustard Indian restaurant which has 25% off food on the lunch menu!

11th July

We go to Big Pit. This will be an early start and a bit later than normal finish. Big Pit needs very little introduction other than to mention it was a working colliery where you go underground and actually walk along the dramways to the coal face. Good shoes and suitable clothing are recommended!

Pontypridd, the home of the Welsh National Anthem and refurbished Lido! Coffee in the Muni Art Centre then a visit to Pontypridd museum and a walk through Ynysangharad Park to view the Lido and on to lunch at the Trattoria or Alfred's Bar and Grill.

5th September

For September we go to the Olde village of Llantrisant. Coffee will be taken at the Butcher's Arms Gallery and Coffee shop. Llantrisant has a long and interesting history. Many will know a little about the surgeon Dr Price. Following his famous trial of 1884 Dr Price saw the Cremation Society of Great Britain famously pass the Cremation Act of 1902. We may be able to have a guided tour as well as visit the church. In Llantrisant we find the Bull Ring once used for bull baiting as well as the opportunity to visit the Model house. This has three levels packed with interesting craft shops and studios. Lunch will be in Talbot Green.
